A SCRIBE INSTRUCTED IN THE KINGDOM BRINGS FORTH NEW AND OLD TREASURES

Mat 13:51 Jesus saith unto them, Have ye understood all these things? They say unto him, Yea, Lord.

Mat 13:52 Then said he unto them, Therefore every scribe [which is] instructed unto the **KINGDOM OF HEAVEN** is like unto a man [that is] an householder, which bringeth forth out of his treasure [things] new and old.

Note: After Jesus had told his disciples the parables of the sower, the tares, the mustard seed, the leaven, the treasure hid in a field, the pearl of great price and the net, he asked them if they understood all these things. They said, "Yes". Then he said that every scribe instructed in the Kingdom would be like a householder bringing forth new and old treasures. In Jesus' day, a scribe was a person who wrote books or documents by hand as a profession. Jesus obviously intended his disciples to write down the parables and lessons he had taught them. As scribes instructed in the Kingdom of God, they would be able to write and explain to people all these NEW parables as well as parables, lessons and symbolisms from the OLD Testament. The books of the New Testament are the disciples' finished writings, filled with these old and new treasures.
