PAUL TAUGHT FOR THREE MONTHS ABOUT THE KINGDOM

Act 19:1 And it came to pass, that, while Apollos was at Corinth, Paul having passed through the upper coasts came to Ephesus: and finding certain disciples,

Act 19:2 He said unto them, Have ye received the Holy Ghost since ye believed? And they said unto him, We have not so much as heard whether there be any Holy Ghost.

Act 19:3 And he said unto them, Unto what then were ye baptized? And they said, Unto John's baptism.

Act 19:4 Then said Paul, John verily baptized with the baptism of repentance, saying unto the people, that they should believe on him which should come after him, that is, on Christ Jesus.

Act 19:5 When they heard [this], they were baptized in the name of the Lord Jesus.

Act 19:6 And when Paul had laid [his] hands upon them, the Holy Ghost came on them; and they spake with tongues, and prophesied.

Act 19:7 And all the men were about twelve.

Act 19:8 And he went into the synagogue, and spake boldly for the space of three months, disputing and persuading the things concerning the **KINGDOM OF GOD**.

Act 19:9 But when divers were hardened, and believed not, but spake evil of that way before the multitude, he departed from them, and separated the disciples, disputing daily in the school of one Tyrannus.

Act 19:10 And this continued by the space of two years; so that all they which dwelt in Asia heard the word of the Lord Jesus, both Jews and Greeks.

Note: Here we see that the Apostle Paul found twelve men in Ephesus who were baptized by John the Baptist, but did not receive the holy spirit until he baptized them again in the name of the Lord Jesus. This tells us that God the Father will not give his holy spirit even to those who are baptized and repent of their sins unless they also believe in his son Jesus Christ. After their baptism, Paul continued to teach them in the synagogue the things about the Kingdom of God for three months. And when persecution arose, he did not get discouraged because there were only twelve men who believed, but separated the believers from the unbelievers and continued teaching for two years.

Lessons we can learn from these verses:

Have you been baptized?

Have you repented of your sins?

Was your baptism done in the belief of Jesus Christ, the Son of God?

Did your minister continue to teach you the things pertaining to the Kingdom of God?
