TRUE FREEDOM

The collapse of a dictator's regime was symbolised in April, 2003 when a huge statue of Saddam Hussein in central Baghdad was toppled. Crowds danced and cheered as it fell to the ground. On December 13, 2003, U.S. forces finally captured the Iraqi president in Operation Red Dawn.

As we celebrate the release of Iraq from the bondage of dictatorship, we ought to reflect on true freedom which is typified by the deliverance of ancient Israel from their bondage in Egypt. Moses instructed them to slay a lamb and put his blood on their door posts. On that night the Lord PASSED OVER Israelite houses with the lamb's blood and slew all firstborn Egyptians. Hundreds of thousands of Israelites left Egypt the next day. Consider the joy they must have felt when they were saved after hundreds of years of bondage. When Moses brought them out, did he say, "Freedom is the power to elect your own

leaders!" No. He gave them a much greater freedom. He led them to Mt Sinai where God, with a thundering voice that every one heard, gave them what the New Testament calls, THE PERFECT LAW OF LIBERTY, the ten commandments, the COVENANT God made between himself and us.

The Old Covenant given at Mt Sinai provided the letter of the law graven on stones. The New Covenant gives us the spirit (inner intent and broad application) of the law graven in our hearts becoming part of our character and way of life. As we daily meditate on God's words, learning to keep and practice them in spirit, we become more and more like our Father, God.

GOD'S COVENANT WITH US

The Two Great Commandments

- * Love the Lord thy God with all thy heart, all thy soul, all thy mind and all thy strength.
- * Love thy neighbor as thyself.

The Ten Commandments

- * I am the Lord thy God, which have brought thee out of the land of Egypt, out of the house of bondage.
 - * Thou shalt have no other gods before me.
- * Thou shalt not make unto thee any graven image or any likeness of anything in heaven or in earth. Thou shalt not bow down thyself to them nor serve them.
 - * Thou shalt not take the name of the Lord thy God in vain.
- * Remember the Sabbath day, to keep it holy. The seventh day is the Sabbath of the Lord thy God. In it thou shalt not do any work. For in six days the Lord made heaven and earth and rested the seventh day. Wherefore the Lord blessed the Sabbath day and hallowed it.
 - * Honor thy father and thy mother.

- * Thou shalt not kill.
- * Thou shalt not commit adultery.
- * Thou shalt not steal.
- * Thou shalt not bear false witness against thy neighbor.
- * Thou shalt not covet any thing that is thy neighbor's

The New Commandment

* Love one another as I (Jesus) have loved you.

Jesus answered them, Verily, verily, I say unto you, Whosoever committeth sin is the servant of sin

2Cor 3:17 Now the Lord is that Spirit: and where the Spirit of the Lord is, there is liberty.

Gal 5:13 For ye have been called unto liberty; only use not liberty for an occasion to the flesh, but by love serve one another.

1Pe 2:16 As free, and not using your liberty for a cloke of maliciousness, but as the servants of God.

James 2:25 Whoso looketh into the perfect law of liberty, and continueth therein, he being not a forgetful hearer, but a doer of the work, this man shall be blessed in his deed.

James 2:12 So speak ye, and so do, as they that shall be judged by the law of liberty.

Deut 6:12 Beware lest thou forget the Lord, which brought thee forth out of the land of Egypt, from the house of bondage

Gal 4:31-5:1 Stand fast therefore in the liberty wherewith Christ hath made us free, and be not entangled again with the yoke of bondage.
